

## Traditional Music Heralds Launch Of School

TRADITIONAL music and dance groups from St. Catherine and Paul's Senior High Schools in the Volta region last week enchanted a group of politicians, educationists, donors and the general public at Agbakope, a small town in the South Tongu district.

Performing at the formal launch of St. Catherine Senior High School, both groups delighted the ears and eyes of the audience with rhythms from loud African drums that flowed through the auditorium with controlled intensity.

Young bodies moved in complete unison as they celebrated a school that is earmarked to help sustain girl child education in the Volta region. Indeed, bodies swayed while Agbadza rhythms filled the air, drawing cheers from the enthusiastic audience.

AddYouCation, a German Non-Governmental Organization dedicated to the support of school projects in deprived areas, played a major role in the construction of the school, which has a total of 165 students and 32 teachers.

The NGO donated a total of 150,000.00 Euros towards the construction of a dormitory for students while experts were sent to the site to assist in completing building plans and other supervisory duties.

Following the intervention by AddYouCation, the Mick Stevens Foundation from The Netherlands supported the construction of a dining hall. Both organizations are willing to offer further support for the school.

With a prestigious architectural office in the background, AddYouCation ensures an indicative implementation of prospective projects while supporting with manpower, technology and administrators.

Following the successful launch, the relationship between St. Catherine Senior High School and AddYouCation is set to continue, with other donors and supporters getting on board this noble project.
